After much consideration, I am writing to formally resign from my current position with Save the Children, and kindly request permission that Friday, January 17<sup>th</sup> be my final working day.

This decision was not made lightly, as my time with Save the Children has been deeply rewarding. Words cannot fully express the gratitude I feel to work alongside our colleagues in Myanmar, whose courage and resilience is a source of motivation for me each and every day. I am choosing to leave not out of discontent nor regret, but because another opportunity that offers stability for my family, professional growth, and a continued focus on supporting communities in Myanmar has presented itself.

The new role provides a long-term visa, bringing a great deal of peace of mind for my family after relocating to Chiang Mai, along with additional benefits such as reasonable pay with added allowances to cover living and childcare expenses. It also offers the chance to broaden my roles in strategic planning and managing a small team in Myanmar, all from an office near my home in Chiang Mai.

I have discussed with the employer that an immediate transition before the end of the year would not be feasible. While they have already allowed some flexibility, they have drawn a clear line that the position must be filled after January 17<sup>th</sup>.

During my transition period, I am fully committed to ensuring a smooth handover of my responsibilities and contributing to any essential deliverables for the New Business Development Team. I am also prepared to work closely with my supervisor to support in this process.
